6. Implement the full array of Cognitive Behavioral and Offense-Specific curricula for juvenile or adult individuals.
7. Teach understanding and appreciation of one's own communication and learning style and the styles of others by using the NCTI Real Colors Personality Instrument.

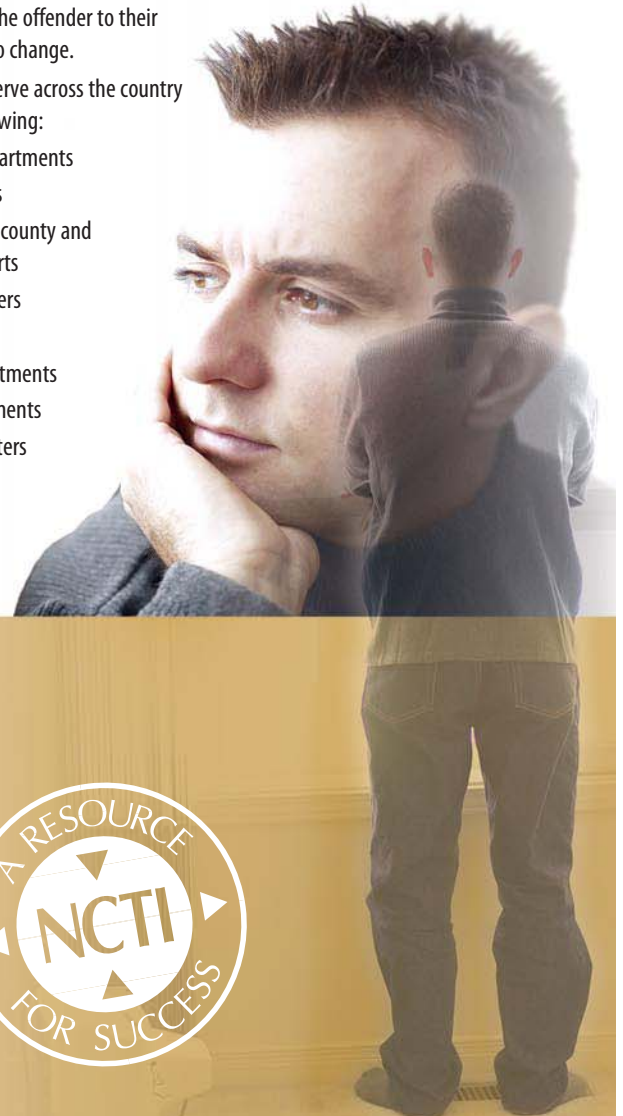
